The Charles Boardman Challenge Cup

The Charles Boardman Challenge Cup, the Association's most prestigious award, is rotated each year between Cattle, Sheep, and Pigs. This year, it is to be awarded to the most successful exhibit in the **Sheep** Classes. The Donald McLean Memorial Trophy will be awarded to the handler in-charge of the winning exhibit.

Public Safety in Livestock Lines.

In the interest of public safety, the livestock lines will be closed whilst the main movements of livestock for judging and for the Grand Parade are in progress. Livestock exhibitor's wristbands will admit them to the livestock lines at all times. This wristband is not transferable and must be worn. No- one other than wristband holders will be allowed to enter.

Will Owners, Exhibitors, Competitors and Attendants Please Note: Rule 10 i), ii) & iii) under 'Conditions of Entry'

- i) Livestock boxes/trailers are admitted with the relevant vehicle pass and must be parked as directed by Stewards. Cars carrying tack in support of boxes/trailers must enter the Showground through the Livestock entrance.
- ii) Every person entering the showground, including drivers of Livestock wagons/trailers must have a valid entrance ticket or pay the full price of admission at the gate (£18). This regulation will be strictly enforced. The show will not take responsibility for any tickets, which may have been mislaid or forgotten. No refunds will be considered unless application is made in writing to the Secretary. All persons on leaving the showground who wish to re-enter must obtain a pass from the Gate Stewards.
- iii) All owners making exhibit applications through an agent and who wish to attend the show will be required to apply in writing to the Secretary by 20th April 2025 for issue of an exhibitor's ticket. All owners, exhibitors, competitors and attendants will be required to have an exhibitor's ticket to gain free access to the showground. No entry will be allowed without a ticket, unless normal gate charges are paid. No refunds will be considered unless application is made in writing to the Secretary.
